

David Maghradze has graduated Georgian Agricultural Institute and obtained his PhD at the Research Institute of Horticulture, Viticulture and Winemaking belonging to the Georgian Agricultural Academy of Sciences in 1994. In 1986 he started his carrier as a researcher at the same Institute of Horticulture, Viticulture and Winemaking; in 2013 he started to work in the National Wine Agency of Georgia and since 2018 he is a professor of the Caucasus International University and Georgian Technical University in the field of viticulture. Since 2003 D. Maghradze is a participant of several international projects dedicated to study

grapevine genetic resources like "Conservation and study of grapevine genetic resources of the Caucasus and Northern black sea region area" (IPGRI), Eco-Net (French Government), GrepeGene06, COST Action FA 1003. In parallel he was a supervisor or a principal researcher of the projects of Shota Rustaveli National Science Foundation of Georgia studding the local grapevine genetic resources – including wild and cultivated grapes - of the country. D. Maghradze is the coordinator of the "Research Project on Study of Georgian Grapes and Wine Culture" leaded by the National Wine Agency. Scientific interest of D. Maghradze covers i) Georgian autochthonous varieties, their description and investigation by various methods of research; ii) Different aspects of research on Georgian grapes and wine culture.

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
