

Dr Xinyi Liu is an archaeologist interested in food, environment, and early farming practices in East Asia and beyond. Born and bred in Beijing, Liu received his PhD degree at the University of Cambridge and subsequently conducted postdoctoral research (under Martin Jones' ERC project FOGLIP) and was elected as a Research Fellow of Darwin College. In 2014, Liu moved to Washington University in St. Louis, where he is currently a tenured Associate Professor of archaeology and director of the Laboratory for the Analysis of Early Food-webs (LAEF). Liu's current research focuses on a period of food globalization between 7000 and 3500 years ago and examines the mechanisms farmers and herders employed to incorporate newly introduced domesticates into long-standing cultural and environmental conditions. His research has been funded by National Science Foundation and European Research Council. He is a member of the editorial board of *PLOS One* and *Environmental Archaeology* and an associate editor of *Frontiers in Plant Science*.

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
